Their wide body S550 package is not limited to carbon fiber body mods. The interior, of course, gets an appearance and tech tweak but the Whipple supercharger and serious suspensions upgrades including huge Brembos make the show pony a go pony, too. If you go with everything, expect to add \$100K to your GT's sticker price.

Get Exposed!

A few of you already know about it, but most may not; Ford has an online Special Vehicle Registry available to all Mustang owners. It's a nice site to browse for ideas for things to do to your car(s) or maybe avoid like the plague. You don't need a Roush, Saleen, Shelby, Bullitt, Mach I or any other special edition to qualify. All you need to do is have your Mustang's VIN handy, and enter some basic personal info. You enter your data and submit the registration form and they will review it before approving your post. Once they have granted it, you will receive an email letting you know and that process only takes about one work day or so. Log back in and you will notice any inaccuracies in the vehicle

description will be corrected by the Ford records associated with your car's VIN. Hopefully you won't get an unwelcome surprise to find out your car was born differently than what the party you bought it from told you. If you own multiple Mustangs, you can register each one, too.
